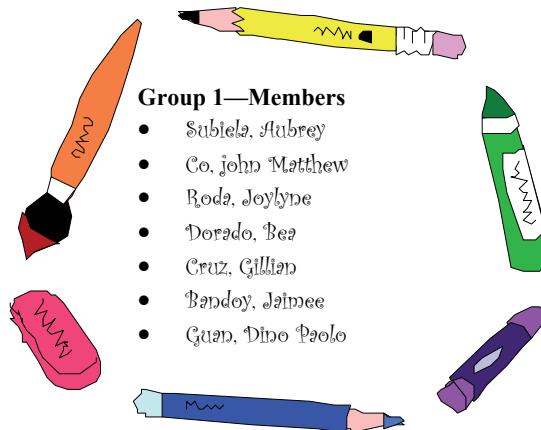

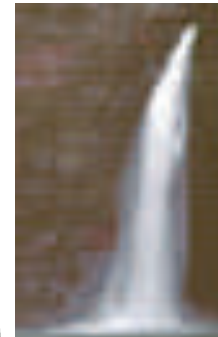

## ▶ Pagsanjan Town



The town of Pagsanjan was originally known as Pinagsanghan and once a barrio of Lumban. Famous for its flourishing betel nut industry, it became the trading center in the eastern part of Laguna. Because of this, it became a town in 1668. It then bloomed as a Cultural and commercial center and the tourism capital of the province. The major source of income of the Pagsaneños is agriculture and its tourism industry.



Pagsanjan is about two-hour drive from Metro Manila by private vehicle. It is also accessible thru public utility vehicles like buses and jeepneys.

## ▶ Pagsanjan Falls

The main attraction in the town of Pagsanjan is the majestic Pagsanjan Falls. It gives an ambience that soothes the heart of tourists. The boat ride to and from the falls is an exciting adventure with nature. On the way to the main falls is an enchanting journey by the river. Upon reaching the falls, a raft awaits adventurous tourists. The ride in the bamboo raft brings tourists to the cave underneath the falls. The return trip, often referred to as “shooting the rapids”, is a thrilling ride, splashing through fresh waters.

## ▶ Puerta Real

The Town Gate, or the Puerta Real is the most significant landmark in the history of Pagsanjan. This structure, built in 18-78-1880, is 124 years old. It reminds Pagsanjeños of the miracle that their patroness, Our Lady of Guadalupe, did to protect the town from bandits.



## ▶ Shrine of Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe



This very old church was originally built of bamboo and nipa. It was replaced in 1690 by a structure made of massive adobe stones with lime mixed with carabao milk. Its high bell tower and gorgeous dome were designed by a priest-engineer named Fr. Joaquin de Coria in 1853. The Pagsanjenos were the ones supplying the labor, materials, and funds then. The church is now administered by Rev. Fr. Rey Agramon.
